#### **About IASSH:**

This multidisciplinary conference provides an opportunity for academicians, researchers, medical practitioners, funding partners, philanthropists, and non-profit organizations to exchange their research work, ideas, and policy perspectives.

## **Inaugural Session**

The conference began with a formal inauguration at the Anand Swaroop Auditorium of Sharda University at 10:00 AM on 15th March, 2023. The lighting of the lamp and invocation of the deity marked the beginning of the conference, followed by the felicitation of guests, presentation of mementos, and bouquets. 



#### Sixth Prof. John Caldwell Memorial Lecture

The Doyen of Demography, Professor John Charles (Jack) Caldwell, died on 12th March 2016 at the age of 87 in Canberra. He was associated with the Department of Demography of the Australian National University (ANU) for decades. Caldwell's seminal many work included documentation of the role of mother's education in fertility limitation and child mortality decline and the role of circumcision in inhibiting the spread of HIV/AIDS in Africa. He is known for his "wealth flows" theory, which relates demographic transition theory to changes in intergenerational transfers within the family. He has encouraged and mentored




many young scholars from India, and a good number of them received their Ph.Ds from ANU under his able guidance. His anthropological demographic work on South India, particularly on marriage, fertility and contraception, received much research attention. At the initiative of Prof. K.N.M. Raju, his students, colleagues and friends have approached the Indian Association for Social Sciences and Health (IASSH) to institute a memorial lecture in his honour. Considering this request, the IASSH instituted the lecture series in memory of the most famous demographer of our times.

The Sixth Prof. John Caldwell Memorial Lecture was held at the Anand Swaroop Auditorium, Sharda University. Prof. T V Sekher, (President, IASSH) chaired the session. The session began with an introduction by Prof. K.N. M. Raju about the life and works of Prof. John Caldwell, a renowned demographer who contributed significantly to the field of demography.

The guest speaker was Prof. Amitabh Kundu (Professor Emeritus at L. J. University, Senior Fellow at



the World Resources Institute and Adjunct Fellow at Research and Information System for Developing Countries.) who delivered the sixth Prof. John Caldwell Memorial Lecture on the theme - "Multi-dimensional Poverty for Planned Intervention and Monitoring in India".

He highlighted the need for a multidimensional approach to poverty measurement and suggested the use of various indicators such as health, education, and access to basic amenities to capture the various dimensions of poverty. Prof. Kundu emphasized the importance of addressing poverty as a multidimensional issue and the need for planned interventions to address the specific needs of various sections of the

population. He also discussed the challenges in monitoring poverty reduction efforts and suggested the use of technology and data-driven approaches for effective monitoring and evaluation.

The lecture was followed by a Q&A session, where the audience had the opportunity to interact with the speaker and clarify their doubts. Dr. Rukmani proposed the vote of thanks, expressing gratitude to the guest speaker, the chairperson, and the audience for their active participation and contribution to the event. Overall, the Sixth Prof. John Caldwell Memorial Lecture provided valuable insights into the multidimensional nature of poverty in India and emphasized the need for a comprehensive approach to poverty reduction efforts.

#### 8th Prof. K. E. Vaidyanathan Memorial Lecture

IASSH has instituted a memorial lecture in honour of Prof. K.E. Vaidyanathan since 2014. He was the President of the Indian Association for Social Sciences and Health (IASSH) from 2007 to 2011 and was mainly responsible for the expansion of the Association to its present form. Dr. Vaidyanathan was a distinguished demographer who served in various capacities in the United Nations and other organizations. He started his career as a faculty at the International Institute for Population Sciences in Mumbai and later became the Head of the Department of Population Studies at the Institute of Rural Health and Family Planning in



Gandhigram. He then joined the UN system and worked in various countries such as Egypt, Syria, Uganda, and Sudan, where he helped establish centers for population studies and research, advised planning commissions, and conducted successful population surveys and censuses. In his later years, he also helped plan and implement the Living Standards Measurement Survey in Bosnia-Herzegovina. Dr. Vaidyanathan passed away in 2014 at Bangalore.

The 8<sup>th</sup> Dr. K. E. Vaidyanathan Memorial Lecture was held at the Chanakya Auditorium, on the 16th of March 2023. The session was chaired by Prof. T V Sekher and co-chaired by Prof. Anviti Gupta. The event was graced by the presence of distinguished personalities, scholars, students. Prof. N. Audinarayana, spoke about the life and contributions of Prof. Vaidyanathan. The speaker for the



event was Prof. Abhiroop Mukhopadhyay from Indian Statistical Institute (ISI) Delhi, who spoke on the topic, "Education and Economic Prosperity: Lessons from the Past and What it Means for Our Future." Prof. Mukhopadhyay's lecture provided valuable insights into the role of education in achieving economic prosperity. He highlighted the importance of education in creating a skilled workforce and driving innovation, which are critical factors in achieving economic growth. He also drew attention to the historical context, illustrating how education has played a critical role in the economic development of various nations in the past.

The lecture was followed by a vote of thanks, by Dr. Ramna Thakur, who expressed her gratitude to all the speakers and participants for their valuable contributions. The event was well-attended, and the audience actively participated in the discussions that followed.



- 3. The paper submitted for consideration of award should be published in a refereed academic journal in the year 2022.
- 4. The applicant should be the **single author**/ **first author** of the published paper.
- 5. The paper should broadly be dealing with social sciences approach in understanding health issues.




